AUR20716 - Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation

This course designed to give students a comprehensive set of skills as a basic introduction to the automotive industry.

The trainee undertaking this course will learn to:

- Service mechanical parts such as the engine, transmission (clutch, gear box and differential)
- Service suspension systems (springs, steering, brakes, wheels and tyres)
- Identify and inspect mechanical and electrical components of light and heavy vehicles, outdoor power equipment and motorcycles
- Perform basic maintenance and repairs

On successful completion of this course, students will have a higher level of skills in automotive increasing their employability potential, and greater likelihood of successfully undertaking an apprenticeship pathway.

Units

To successfully complete this course, you must be assessed as competent in the following units:

- **AURASA002** – Follow safe workplace practices in an automotive workplace
- **AURAEA002** – Follow environmental and sustainability best practice in an automotive workplace

- **AURETK001** – Identify, select and use low voltage electrical test equipment
- **AURTTA009** – Carry out mechanical pre-repair operations
- **AURTTE003** – Remove and tag engine system components
- **AURETR015** – Inspect, test and service batteries
- **AURAF A004** – Resolve routine problems in an automotive workplace

5 weeks.
